# HAPPY NATIONAL SCHOOL COUNSELING WEEK, CSSC/NYC!

National School Counseling week begins on February 1, so this is our time to celebrate all of the work that we do for our students and for our profession.

The role of school counselor has existed for over 100 years. It has evolved over time; for example, we are no longer called "Guidance Counselors." Sure, some people at your school may still call you that and you may even call yourself that sometimes! - but the reality is that you are a school counselor because what you do no longer involves just vocational and career counseling. It is all encompassing!

The role of the School Counselor or, in this case, The *High School Counselor*, involves meeting all of the needs of your students in their final transition into adulthood. We provide counseling about the curriculum, assess student abilities and interests to help them make decisions about their future, provide support during times of stress and crisis and make appropriate external referrals while reminding ourselves that we cannot provide long term therapy.

Sometimes, we need that reminder about our roles. Too often we are pulled in a thousand different directions and are tasked with responsibilities outside of our scope. It is our job to advocate for our students and for ourselves. The only way to be effective counselors for our students is to do the job we were tasked to do for them each and every day. So, this week, celebrate how hard you have worked to help those remote students, or those students who experienced a tragic loss due to COVID, and celebrate your resilience in the face of this tragic time. Whatever personal loss you may have faced, you are there each day for your students ... on the computer or in person. You are

To introduce myself, my name is Sarah Stiglianese and I'm a first year school counselor at Fontbonne Hall in Brooklyn. Definitely a crazy year to get thrown into your first job! But I've been making it work one day at a time, with a lot of support from my Director and hearing about what has been working from other amazing counselors like yourselves. It was great to be able to connect virtually at our first CSSC meeting to share our challenges and triumphs from this school year. While I enjoyed hearing all of your strategies for best supporting our students, I also appreciated connecting with others who are facing similar emotions of being a school counselor in a global pandemic.

One discussion we had at the first meeting was how to help our students get the social connection they are craving, especially those who are fully remote. All of our students, especially the freshmen, are sadly missing out on a fun and interactive high school experience. Although not all of our students cannot be physically together right now, I have been creating new ways for them to connect.

I've been calling these events Virtual Lunch Rooms. Once a week during each lunch period, students from different cohorts come together over Google Meet to eat their lunch, chat, and participate in different activities. So far, we have played the game Among Us (a phone App that students love), TikTok Jeopardy, Disney Pictionary, and everyone's favorite, Kahoot. It is great to see students connect with new and old friends from afar and get some interaction outside of the classroom setting. While the turnout isn't always huge, we have a consistent group of students from all grade levels who eagerly join us each week. It's great to watch their friendships slowly

forming, even through the computer screen.

I know we are all so busy with our other responsibilities it can seem impossible to take time out of our day to plan and run a social event such as this. But even if it is only once a month, I recommend giving it a try and seeing if it is something your students would enjoy. I have made some of my best connections and built rapport with students at these events that translates into our counseling sessions.
